

## School Sport Funding Report

### Impact from April 2016 to March 2017

#### Proposed expenditure from April 2017- March 2018

In September 2013 the Government announced that each school would receive ring-fenced funding for school sports. This funding was initially called Sport Pupil Premium but has recently changed to School Sport Funding. The purpose of this funding is to:

- Raise achievement in weekly PE lessons
- Increase participation in competitive school sport
- Develop personal health and well-being
- Improve attitudes and behaviour towards learning

Below is a summary of how the School Sport Funding has been used at Danehill Co E Primary from April 2016 to March 2017 and proposals for the financial period April 2017 to March 2018.

**Proposals for future expenditure of £8766 (April 2017 – March 2018):**

- Supply teaching to release teachers for competitions and training etc – allowing participation of all area sporting competitions (c£1000)
- PE equipment as suggested through Pupil Voice (c£500)
- Release time for PE Co-ordinator to develop PE assessment, liaise with Chailey Secondary cluster, survey children for pupil voice on PE (c£300)
- Payment for Kids Fitness Zone to provide PE development – 39 weeks (£3900)
- Equipment for Play Leaders so they can successfully implement their games (c£500)
- Swimming coaching to continue and build upon the ASA awards scheme (c£1000)
- Golf day and resource pack – to introduce new sport, develop link with local community and create new after school club opportunity (c£500)
- TA support for travel to swimming (c£250)
- Developing Outdoor Woodland Learning (OWL) area and OAA activities (c£800)

Total proposed expenditure = c£8750
